The Acting Secretary for Home Affairs, Mr Jack Chan, today (February 26) joined major organisations separately to distribute anti-epidemic supplies in several districts with the aim of protecting Hong Kong people's health and safety, and uniting all in the fight against the virus. Mr Chan first presented 50 000 boxes of "Jinhua Qinggan Keli" donated by the Central Government to the Federation of Hong Kong Guangdong Community Organisations for further distribution to people in need.
