Responding to a [Labour Party conference fringe event](#) that concluded “Labour must ‘get over squeamishness’ about attacking Greens”, Green Party Co-Deputy Leader, Mothin Ali, said:

“My free advice to Labour is to stop attacking and start listening. Stop attacking communities that are made up of people living and working here, and who were born abroad. Stop obsessively trying to “attack” your political opponents.

“Instead, start listening. Listen to people who are struggling to survive on disability benefits before cutting them. Listen to parents struggling with the cost of living and the experts who say scrapping the two-child benefit cap is the most cost-effective way of addressing child poverty. And listen to all of us who have been calling out the unfolding genocide in Gaza for the last two years.

“Like many, Labour left me behind, and I found a new home in the Greens. I am now focusing all my energy on growing the Green movement. We have a record membership, a record number of Cllrs and MPs and are hitting record levels in the polls. This is what I’m focused on.”

[Greens announce new membership record on first day of Labour Party conference](#)

On the first day of the Labour Party conference, the Green Party of England and Wales has announced it has surged past 80,000 members – a record high for the party. The announcement was made by Green Party Leader, Zack Polanski, speaking at a campaign event in North London. Over 400 activists gathered to

deliver over 100,000 leaflets as part of the campaign to win the Hackney Mayoral election in 2026 – one of the Green Party’s strategic objectives for 2026.

This new membership record marks a near 20% increase in membership since Polanski was elected leader less than a month ago.

Reacting to the news, Green Party leader Zack Polanski said:

“This is a huge milestone for the Green Party of England and Wales. The tired, old two-party system is over. More and more people are looking to a politics rooted in tackling the climate crisis and inequality. The Green Party is the party that wants to bring water into public hands, wants to lower bills, and wants to protect our National Health Service. Our party conference is just a week away. Our membership growth is a fantastic foundation from which to deepen our roots in local communities and build a bolder politics. This is just the beginning, and we have no time to waste.”

Ahead of the Labour Party conference opening, Zack Polanski had been clear about Green ambitions for 2026 saying,

“When I said we intend to replace Labour, I meant it. As another Labour conference comes round, it’s another emergency government reset. It just confirms what we already know: Labour has failed.
