The Leisure and Cultural Services Department announced today (April 4) that due to big waves, red flags have been hoisted at Stanley Main Beach, Turtle Cove Beach, Shek O Beach and Big Wave Bay Beach in Southern District, Hong Kong Island, and Hap Mun Bay Beach, Silverstrand Beach, Clear Water Bay First Beach and Clear Water Bay Second Beach in Sai Kung District. Beachgoers are advised not to swim at these beaches.

Fatal traffic accident in North Point

Police are investigating a fatal traffic accident in North Point in the small hours today (April 4) in which a 75-year-old man died.

At about 4.50am, a taxi was travelling along Island Eastern Corridor eastbound. When approaching Oil Street, it reportedly knocked down the 75-year-old man. After the impact, the taxi left the scene.

Sustaining multiple injuries, the man was certified dead at scene.

Investigation by the Special Investigation Team of Traffic, Hong Kong Island is underway.
