Green Party candidate Geraldine Coggins has said Reform is abandoning its campaign in Greater Manchester in order to 'save the skin' of Nigel Farage who faces a fight in Clacton against Count Binface.

Leaked WhatsApp messages from Reform yesterday suggested they are diverting their campaign in Greater Manchester to the Clacton byelection.
