HKSAR delegation wins record-breaking eight Winners Awards at APICTA Awards 2024 (with photos)

The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) delegation achieved remarkable results at the Asia Pacific Information and Communications Technology Alliance (APICTA) Awards 2024, held in Bandar Seri Begawan, Brunei from December 4 to 7.
