<u>Results of applications for ninth-</u> <u>round funding exercise of Arts</u> <u>Capacity Development Funding Scheme</u> <u>announced</u>

The Home Affairs Bureau today (July 3) announced the results of applications for the ninth-round funding exercise of the Arts Capacity Development Funding Scheme. A total of 13 successful applications for Project Grants will be funded to a total amount of around \$38.47 million.

A total of 69 applications were received for the ninth-round funding exercise. The successful applications are of a high standard and feature a diverse representation across genres covering music, dance, theatre, visual arts, arts education/appreciation/promotion, community arts and multidisciplinary arts.
