Safety must be always be the top priority, but UK and US bans on carrying electronic devices on aircraft leaves questions unanswered — Richard Burden

Richard Burden MP, Labour's Shadow Aviation Minister, responding to the announcement of a cabin baggage ban on laptops on certain direct passenger flights to the UK from Turkey, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt, Tunisia and Saudi Arabia, said:

"The safety

and security of passengers must always be the overriding priority for Government and for airline operators. If the Government has evidence the level

of security checks on passengers carrying electronic devices is of exceptional

concern in the countries listed then it is right that prompt precautionary action should be taken.

"This

announcement leaves a number of important questions unanswered and we are seeking

urgent clarification from Ministers. It's important the Government set out clearly the precautionary steps they have taken in response to advice from security services to reassure passengers and the public. The Government must also work with airline operators to ensure all passengers are given the necessary information and flights can continue where appropriate with minimal disruption as possible."
