

## **Appeal for information on missing girl in Wong Tai Sin (with photo)**

Police today (August 28) appealed to the public for information on a girl who went missing in Wong Tai Sin.

Cai Jiayi, aged 14, went missing after she left her caring home in Choi Wan Estate on August 26 afternoon. Her family made a report to Police today.

She is about 1.55 metres tall, 43 kilograms in weight and of normal build. She has a round face with yellow complexion and long brown hair. She was last seen wearing a white checkered vest, a brown skirt, black long boots, and carrying a white handbag.

Anyone who has provided his or her personal information, or who has conducted any financial transactions, through or in response to the App concerned, should contact the bank using the contact information provided in the press release, and report the matter to the Police by contacting the Crime Wing Information Centre of the Hong Kong Police Force at 2860 5012.

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## Cluster of Candida auris cases in Hong Kong Buddhist Hospital

The following is issued on behalf of the Hospital Authority:

The spokesperson for Hong Kong Buddhist Hospital (HKBH) made the following announcement today (August 28):

A 91-year-old female patient in a medicine ward of HKBH was confirmed to be carrying *Candida auris* on August 24 without signs of infection. The patient had been discharged earlier. In accordance with the prevailing guideline, HKBH conducted contact tracing and found two more female patients, aged 89 and 93, carrying *Candida auris* without signs of infection. The two patients are now being treated under isolation and are in stable condition.

The ward concerned has adopted the following enhanced infection control measures:

1. Enhanced patient and environmental screening procedures;
2. Applied stringent contact precautions and enhanced hand hygiene of staff and patients; and
3. Thorough cleaning and disinfection of the ward concerned.

The hospital will continue the enhanced infection control measures and closely monitor the situation in the ward. The cases have been reported to the Hospital Authority Head Office and the Centre for Health Protection for necessary follow-up.
