Annual update to list of Financial Services Providers under OTC derivatives regulatory regime

The following is issued on behalf of the Hong Kong Monetary Authority:

The Hong Kong Monetary Authority (HKMA) and the Securities and Futures Commission (SFC) today (June 24) issued the <u>joint consultation conclusions</u> on the annual update to the list of Financial Services Providers (FSP List) (Note 1) under the over-the-counter (OTC) derivatives clearing regime.

Having considered the <u>market feedback</u>, the HKMA and the SFC will proceed with the proposed changes to the FSP List as set out in the joint consultation paper (Note 2). The consultation conclusions paper and the updated FSP List can be downloaded from the websites of the <u>HKMA</u> and the <u>SFC</u>.

Note 1: The FSP List includes entities that meet the following two criteria: (i) They belong to a group of companies appearing on the list of global systemically important banks published by the Financial Stability Board, or on the list of dealer groups which undertook to the OTC Derivatives Supervisors Group to work collaboratively with central counterparties, infrastructure providers and global supervisors to make structural improvements to the global OTC derivatives markets; and (ii) They are members of the largest central counterparties offering clearing for interest rate swaps in the United States, Europe, Japan and Hong Kong.

<u>Man sentenced for breaching compulsory</u> <u>quarantine order</u>

A 48-year-old man was sentenced to immediate imprisonment for six days by the Tuen Mun Magistrates' Courts today (June 24) for violating the Compulsory Quarantine of Certain Persons Arriving at Hong Kong Regulation (Cap. 599C).

The man was earlier issued a compulsory quarantine order stating that he must conduct quarantine at home for 14 days. Before the expiry of the quarantine order, he left the place of quarantine on June 11, 2021, without reasonable excuse nor permission given by an authorised officer and was

stopped by an immigration officer at the Shenzhen Bay Control Point. He was charged with two counts of contravening sections 8(1), 8(4) and 8(5) of the Regulation and was sentenced by the Tuen Mun Magistrates' Courts to immediate imprisonment for six days for each of the two charges, with the sentences to run concurrently.

Breaching a quarantine order is a criminal offence and offenders are subject to a maximum fine of \$25,000 and imprisonment for six months. A spokesman for the Department of Health said the sentence sends a clear message to the community that breaching a compulsory quarantine order is a criminal offence that the Government will not tolerate, and solemnly reminded the public to comply with the regulations. As of today, a total of 146 persons have been convicted by the courts for breaching compulsory quarantine orders and have received sentences including immediate imprisonment for up to 14 weeks or a fine of up to \$15,000. The spokesman reiterated that resolute actions will be taken against anyone who has breached the relevant regulations.

Dr Cheung is a seasoned senior executive with solid management experience at the corporate level. He maintains and enhances cluster liaison and performance monitoring functions to support the strategic direction of the HA, such as driving the development of the Key Performance Indicator framework for service improvement and performance monitoring. He is also the overall person in charge to manage the demand surge in winter within the HA to alleviate the immense pressure on hospital staff while maintaining the standard of care in patient management.

The HA Chairman, Mr Henry Fan, and the HA Chief Executive, Dr Tony Ko,

congratulated Dr Cheung on his new appointment and wished him every success in taking up the new role.



Communications Authority press release

The following is issued on behalf of the Communications Authority:

This press release summarises the decisions of the Communications Authority (CA) following its 108th meeting held in June 2021:

Breach of licence condition by WarnerMedia Asia Pacific (HK) Limited (WMAP)

The CA decided that WMAP, a non-domestic television programme service (non-domestic TV) licensee, has breached Condition 10.1 of its non-domestic TV licence by failing to seek the requisite approval of the CA prior to the implementation of a change to the line-up of programme channels during the period from December 16, 2020, to March 15, 2021. Taking into account the circumstances of the case as well as the nature, duration and severity of the breach, the CA decided that WMAP should be strongly advised to observe the relevant licence condition more closely.

Breach of licence condition by Phoenix Satellite Television Company Limited (Phoenix)

The CA decided that Phoenix, a non-domestic TV licensee, has breached Condition 10.1 of its non-domestic TV licence by failing to seek the requisite approval of the CA prior to the implementation of the changes to the shareholding structure of Phoenix during the periods from July 18, 2018, to March 24, 2021, and from August 22, 2018, to March 24, 2021. Taking into

account the circumstances of the case as well as the nature, duration and severity of the breach, the CA decided that Phoenix should be advised to observe the relevant licence condition more closely.

Broadcast complaint

The CA considered a complaint case about the television advertisement for "JcoNAT Naturally-Existing Disinfectant" broadcast on the Jade Channel of Television Broadcasts Limited (TVB) in June 2020. The CA decided that TVB should be advised to observe more closely the relevant provision of the Generic Code of Practice on Television Advertising Standards. Government posts notices of land resumption and acquisition for Tung Chung New Town Extension development

The Lands Department (LandsD) today (June 24) posted notices in accordance with section 4 of the Lands Resumption Ordinance (Chapter 124), section 4 of the Land Acquisition (Possessory Title) Ordinance (Chapter 130), section 14 of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370), and section 14 of Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) for the resumption and acquisition of land for implementation of public housing development in Area 46, and other facilities and infrastructure works for the Tung Chung New Town Extension development.

A total of 294 private lots with an area of about 4.94 hectares will be resumed and the land which is occupied by a grave with an area of about 22.6 square meters will be acquired. The said land will revert to or vest in the Government upon the expiry of a period of three months from the date of affixing the notices (i.e. September 25, 2021).

The Government will maintain close liaison with the relevant land owners and affected households and business undertakings, and properly handle their compensation and rehousing matters.

The public housing development in Area 46, Tung Chung, will provide a total of about 1 550 flats upon full completion. The first batch of population intake is expected in 2028.
