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## **Red flag hoisted at Butterfly Beach**

The Leisure and Cultural Services Department announced today (June 15) that according to the Beach Water Quality Forecast System of the Environmental Protection Department ([www.epd.gov.hk/epd/english/environmentinhk/water/beach\\_quality/forecast\\_system.html](http://www.epd.gov.hk/epd/english/environmentinhk/water/beach_quality/forecast_system.html)), the Beach Water Quality Forecast Index for Butterfly Beach in Tuen Mun District is 4, which means the predicted water quality at this beach is "Very Poor" due to potential transient water quality fluctuations caused by heavy rain. The red flag has been hoisted, and beachgoers are advised not to enter the water to safeguard their health.

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## **Lifesaving services suspended at Hap Mun Bay Beach**

The Leisure and Cultural Services Department announced today (June 15) that due to big waves, red flags have been hoisted at South Bay Beach, Deep Water Bay Beach, Stanley Main Beach, Shek O Beach and Big Wave Bay Beach in Southern District, Hong Kong Island; Hung Shing Yeh Beach, Cheung Chau Tung Wan Beach, Silver Mine Bay Beach and Pui O Beach in Islands District; and Clear Water Bay Second Beach in Sai Kung District. Beachgoers are advised not to swim at these beaches.

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## **Drone tech boosts efficiency**

The Government recently launched the first batch of low-altitude economy Regulatory Sandbox pilot projects and under this framework, CLP Power's drone team began a beyond-visual-line-of-sight pilot scheme to inspect overhead lines at a test site in Sai Kung.

News.gov.hk spoke to the company's representative to learn more about the details of its pilot scheme, while a Civil Aviation Department Operations Officer shared how the Government's legislative amendments can facilitate the development of a low-altitude economy in Hong Kong.
