

Fatal traffic accident in Hung Hom

Police are investigating a fatal traffic accident in Hung Hom this morning (January 7) in which an 85-year-old woman died.

At about 9.34am, a medium goods vehicle (MGV) driven by a 24-year-old man was travelling along eastbound Wuhu Street. When approaching near the junction of Wuhu Street and Dock Street, it reportedly knocked down the 85-year-old woman who was crossing the road.

Sustaining head injuries, the woman was rushed to Queen Elizabeth Hospital in unconscious state and was certified dead at 10.00am.

The MGV driver was arrested for dangerous driving causing death and is being detained for further enquiries.

Investigation by the Special Investigation Team of Traffic, Kowloon West is underway.

FEHD orders Yuen Long restaurant to suspend business for 14 days

The Director of Food and Environmental Hygiene has ordered a restaurant in Yuen Long to suspend business for 14 days as the operator repeatedly breached the Food Business Regulation (FBR) by extending its business area illegally.

The restaurant, Bum Mei Sin Kitchen, located at Shop 10, 10A, 11, on the ground floor and the outside seating accommodation at shop front, Ho King

Building, 10-28 Hop Yick Road, Yuen Long, was ordered to suspend business from today (January 7) to January 20.

"In June 2019, two convictions for the above-mentioned breach were recorded against the restaurant. A total fine of \$17,000 was levied by the court and 30 demerit points were registered against the licensee under the department's demerit points system. The contraventions resulted in the 14-day licence suspension," a spokesman for the Food and Environmental Hygiene Department (FEHD) said.

The licensee of the restaurant had a record of two convictions for the same offence in January and February 2019. A total fine of \$16,500 was levied and 30 demerit points were also registered. The breaches led to a licence suspension for seven days in May in the same year.

The spokesman reminded the licensees of food premises to comply with the FBR or their licences could be suspended or cancelled.

Licensed food premises are required to exhibit a sign, at a conspicuous place near the main entrance, indicating that the premises have been licensed. A list of licensed food premises is available on the FEHD's website (www.fehd.gov.hk/english/licensing/index.html).
